- Plant the seeds for participants to see themselves as the creators and storytellers
- Plant the seeds for processes to keep participants on task, taking turns, and working together

Session 1 Brief Overview

Session 1 is where everyone is finding their place among the group. The space is designed to be safe and predictable where your young person feels welcome and accepted for who they are. Your young person should bring an item from home they feel comfortable talking about with others.

SESSION OUTLINE

1 INTRODUCTIONS	Your young person will start to get to know their group and their facilitator/s. Facilitators will introduce themselves before inviting your
10 minutes 2 WARM UP 10 minutes	Your young person will get to interact with their group. Your young person will be invited to play a game where they try and keep an object (balloon or soft toy) from falling to the ground. During this game your young person will be asked to think of an adjective to go in front of their name to be used by others during the game.
3 TUNING IN 10 minutes	Your young person will be invited to talk about the special item they have brought from home. Each participant will be given around 2 minutes to participate
4 ACTION 15 minutes	In this program your young person gets the opportunity to be a movie writer, producer, and director! In this part of the session your young person will discuss their favourite film and begin developing a character for the groups movie. Your young person will get the opportunity to create their character out of modelling clay to be used in all future sessions.
