### **Session 8: The Grand Finale**



#### Aims of Session 8:

- To film the movie
- Celebrate the completion of the program.
- Draw on participants' strengths and interests.

#### **Session 8 Brief Overview**

Session 8 is the grand finale of the Imagine Create Belong | Social Development Program. This session will see your young person's movie be filmed along with a celebration of the program coming to a close.

#### **SESSION OUTLINE**

1
INTRODUCTIONS
2 minutes

The facilitator will introduce the session explaining that it is the grand finale and will see if there are any questions from the previous session

#### |2| **WARM UP** |5 minutes|

This activity is called "Desert Island". The facilitator will ask your young person to pretend they have been transported to a deserted island for a year. The facilitator will explain that in addition to essentials you can take one book, one film, and one luxury item. Your young person will be invited to talk about their chosen items and why they chose them.

# |4| ACTION |45 minutes|

There is no tuning in activity this week. Rather the action activity will take up most of the session with the group's movie finally being filmed. The group will have allocated jobs or roles and will be actively involved in the direction of the film.

#### |5| **WRAPPING UP** |*5 minutes*|

This is a celebration! After the filming of the movie the group may have something to eat and drink. Your young person will be provided with a memento of their time in the program. The facilitator will organise how the group receives a copy of the movie. This could include an unlisted YouTube link, a USB, etc.
